
Year 5 Curriculum Autumn Term

English

In English, children will be looking at the book, Curiosity: The Story of a Mars Rover by Marcus Motum. Through this book, they will learn about space exploration and build links with their



topic work. We will be building on the skills learnt last year of narrative writing as well as newspaper reports.

Children will continue to be encouraged to read at home to foster that love of reading and we will encourage children to make use of the new book nook in our area to support this. In class, we will develop inference skills and continue to build on our ability to understand unfamiliar words in

<u>Maths</u>

In maths, the children will continue to develop their understanding of the place value and the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

They will continue to build upon the skills that they developed last year, using a range of methods to explore mathematical concepts and justifying their answers and ideas using mathematical language.

The most important thing to develop fluency is the rapid recall of times tables and other facts such as prime and square numbers—so practise regularly.



Other Curriculum Areas

Computing:

In computing this term, the children will use ICT to develop and support their learning in their topic work. We will be learning key skills associated with Google Classroom to support homework tasks.

Alongside this we will be focusing on E-Safety and raising the children's awareness of how to remain safe when online. We will also be developing the children's understanding of their own digital footprint and the impact that this can have on their future.

PE

We are very lucky to be working with Commando

French

In French, children will be learning how to use directions and talk about the things that they may find on the high street. They will be developing their ability to use vocabulary that they have learnt to hold a conversation with their peers.

<u>RE</u>

In RE, we will be exploring the importance of place of worship for a range of faiths.



Homework is an important part of Year 5, and will support the children's progress by giving them an opportunity to consolidate their understanding of new concepts and practice their skills.
